### **OUR NOVEMBER SPEAKER**

Professor Ruth Murray-Clay will speak on the topic of the formation and evolution of planetary systems, including the solar system. Ruth Murray-Clay is an Assistant Professor of Theoretical Astrophysics in the Physics Department at the University of California, Santa Barbara. From 2010-2014, Ruth was a federal Astrophysicist at the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory, an Affiliate (2013-2014) and Lecturer in the Harvard Department of Astronomy, and a senior member of the Institute for Theory and Computation, all of which are part of the Harvard-Smithsonian Center for Astrophysics. She was an Institute for Theory and Computation Postdoctoral Fellow at Harvard from 2008-2010. Ruth received her Ph.D. in Astrophysics in 2008 from UC Berkeley, where she worked with Eugene Chiang. She has an A.B. in Physics and Astronomy and Astrophysics from Harvard University.

We will resell that and buy a computer system for the observatory. Look for Paul Winn's sale of the Lunt, and if you are a member in good standing for over a year, there should be a discount. Also, I think you avoid paying 8% sales tax on the resale. Of course, if you want to pay more than retail to the club to make a donation, extra funds will be put to good use and you can list that with your other tax write-offs!

We can always use more folks at our outreaches with or without telescopes, to share your knowledge of astronomy with the public.
